At the heart of all this success is an understanding of what people are seeking today.


In a fast-paced world, people want connection, belonging, and affordability—and Moose Lodges provide all three.

Their personal follow-up calls to new members create genuine hospitality and make people feel like they are part of something truly special.


That level of execution is why their orientation program is so successful and serves as a model for all lodges.



JUNE: Feed a Home in December. Family Teachers and children head to local grocery stores, on a weekly basis, to purchase food items through this program.

JULY: Mooseheart Girls' Athletic Program. Mooseheart offers an outstanding sports program for girls that enables the students to take part in basketball, volleyball, track and bowling.

AUGUST: Mooseheart Boys Athletic Program. Mooseheart provides every boy an opportunity to take an active part in the soccer, basketball, wrestling and track.

SEPTEMBER: Moosehaven Vision, Hearing and Dental. This program helps with the cost of eye exams and glasses; hearing tests and devices, as well as regular dental exams.

OCTOBER. "Christmas in October". At Mooseheart, this program covers photo Christmas cards, Christmas parties, decorations and special treats. At Moosehaven, special events include the annual Christmas dinner and party, New Year's Eve party, Thanksgiving dinner, off campus trips as well as the many monthly social gatherings both on campus and at the Life Care Center.

NOVEMBER: Mooseheart Music Department. This fund provides an opportunity for students from the 4th grade to the high school seniors to participate in the Mooseheart music program.

DECEMBER: Mooseheart Special Activities Fund. This fund provides the financial assistance necessary for the special activities that take place on campus.

JANUARY: Physical and Occupational Therapy. This program funds for continuation of services, medical treatments for physical and occupational therapy.

FEBRUARY: Moosehaven Pharmacy Budget. This program covers the cost of prescription drugs and over the counter medications and supplies for Moosehaven residents.

MARCH: Mooseheart Photos. From school pictures in September, Homecoming photos in October, pictures with the Easter Bunny in March and athletic team and individual pictures are all covered under this program.

APRIL: Mooseheart 'Starter Kit'. The purchase of new clothing, coats, shoes, personal hygiene items, personal bedding and a few photo frames for each new child when they arrive at Mooseheart gives children a fresh start under this WOTM-funded program.
