So, when you are at the Mid-Year Conference stop by her table and welcome her and her committee aboard.


Florida Day is just around the corner and the excitement is building.

The 2025-26 Endowment Giving cycle is off to a powerful start, as Florida Moose members have wholeheartedly embraced this year’s campaign theme: “Moving Forward and Giving Back.”



Early indicators show not only a significant increase in overall giving, but also a rise in the number of Lodges consistently meeting their monthly endowment goals, a key benchmark for achieving Premier Lodge status.

This momentum is doing more than boosting numbers.

It is strengthening awareness of the Moose’s core mission and the life-changing support provided at Mooseheart Child City & School and Moosehaven City of Contentment.

At the heart of this mission is a simple, powerful commitment: to celebrate life together and to serve those in need. Especially children and seniors.

Florida Leads with Heart

Last June, Florida Moose members stood together with a shared sense of purpose and made a meaningful impact.

These results prove that even the smallest contributions matter.

A simple \$1 paper square, signed and hung with pride, can lead to life-changing support for the people who depend on the Moose.

Through a statewide effort to support the Endowment Fund, Florida raised more than \$27,000, bringing new visibility to the essential services Mooseheart and Moosehaven provide.



Over the past two years, Florida experienced a decline in participation in the Cradle program, a trend the Florida Moose Association challenged lodges to reverse. Lodges were encouraged to renew their commitment and increase engagement.

Florida delivered

Not only did more Lodges participate this year, but donations surged past expectations, contributing over \$32,000. Combined, the “Because Florida Cares” campaign and the Cradle program have raised just over \$59,000.



Trust makes a difference in the life of a child, particularly one at risk of falling into negative habits due to poverty, neglect, or fear.


Brandon is a young camper who, when prompted to write about his favorite part of camp, said "Camp is [great] because of the food and the people."
