Several Ranchers participated in the greenhorn rodeo events, testing their skills in preparation for our upcoming Boys Ranch Open House and Horse Show.

"[Events like this] give them a leadership role," Farm Director Jeff Parker explained. "The kids know the trails, so it requires them to be responsible for some-

thing other than themselves in an environment they feel comfortable in."

Leading trail rides at their Ranch home was a great way for Ranchers like Savannah, Aaron, Clover and Brian to meet new people, share their stories and expertise, and practice their social skills.

The Great Florida Cattle Drive, held every five years, is a tradition honoring the original cattle drivers of Florida. Our youth participate in the drive through Operation Outdoor Freedom, a program started by David Hunt of the Florida Department of Agriculture to give wounded veterans new experiences in the great outdoors. Our Ranchers help train veterans on proper riding techniques, prepare them for the drive and support them throughout the event.
