Lodge takes to the fast lane

Provides sponsorships and community service

The relationships built between Moose Lodges and local businesses make tremendous impacts on their communities.

Winter Haven, located in central Florida,

has a lot to offer. From lakes, waterside parks, theme parks like Legoland and PEPPA PIG, Cypress Gardens, forest trails, and wetlands, there is much tourists to do.

The local community also has a Lodge home, Winter Haven Moose Lodge 1023, who has found a unique relationship with a 1/4-mile wyatt ar asphalt racetrack four miles race cars. to the southwest.

What makes this relationship so special is the fact that Rex Guy, who owns Auburndale Speedway, is also a Moose member.

"It's a wonderful relationship," Greg Gilmore said. "We do a lot together for the kids and try to raise awareness of what the Moose Lodge does."

From handing out Tommy Moose during autograph sessions with the drivers, Eas-

ter baskets for the children, and race car sponsorships, the Winter Haven Moose Lodge has found a niche that puts the lodge and the Moose in the fast lane.

Auburndale Speedway is one of Florida's most highly attended race tracks. Centrally located in the state, it has drawn a weekly average of 103 competitors throughout six divisions so far this race season.

And the Moose is a part of their success.

"It's about getting the community support for the up and coming racers, as well as having a fun environment that families can enjoy together," said Rex Guy in a statement on the tracks website auburndalespeedway.net.

"We invite the Moose, give discounts for Moose members on select races, and

> they come out and do their Tommy (Moose)," Rex Guy said.

> Winter Haven Moose Lodge also sponsors four race cars. Two of the cars include the No. 46 of Cody Stickler, and the No. 26 of Jonathan Guy. Both compete in the Super Late Model division.

> They also support two young racers, Wyatt and

Gunner Osteen, who are just starting their race careers.

"They are awesome," Rex Guy said. "They're just phenomenal and do a lot of things at the track."

"People don't understand what the Moose does," Gilmore said of the Moose mission and their local community service efforts. "Once you get them in and they see what

Mark Penzkover Official Visitor

Mark J.K. Penzkover was this year's Official Visitor at the FMA Mid Year Conference.

Penzkover serves as Director/Chaplain on the Moose International, Inc. Board of Directors for The Moose, has served on the Board of Directors since 2015, the Mooseheart Board of Directors (2005-2014), the Audit Committee (2009-2014), and the International Publications Committee (2004-2005).

Mark was President and Valedictorian of the Mooseheart High School Class of 1984.

The youngest of ten children, Mark had been admitted to Mooseheart in 1969 at age 3 along with seven of his siblings after the death of both his parents in an automobile accident.

Following his Mooseheart graduation, Mark attended Purdue University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in civil engineering in 1989 on a Moose scholarship. Mark later earned a Master of Business Administration degree from the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh.

In 2000 he was inducted into the Mooseheart Athletic Hall of Fame and in 2013 he received the Mooseheart Distinguished Alumni Award.

From 2008 to 2013, Mark served the fraternity as the chairman of the Mooseheart Centennial Committee, organizing the 100th anniversary celebration at the Child City in 2013.

He also served the Wisconsin Moose Association as chairman of the annual Mooseheart Tree Lighting Program for 15 years and is a Past President of the Association.

Mark, a member of the 200 Division of the Moose 25 Club, received the Fellowship Degree of Honor in 2001 and the Pilgrim Degree of Merit in 2011.

Mark and his wife Angie are the parents of four grown children and live in Mukwonago, where he has served his community as a Trustee on the Village Board and as a member of the Plan Commission and Library Board.

In less than two days, over \$88,516 in baby products were collected at the Mid Year Conference, \$3,513 in WISH Pillowcases, and volunteered over 20 hours of community service time.

The items were part of the FMA's Greatest Baby Shower, and the do-

nations from our Moose family definitely took this project over the top.

Donations went to Healthy Start Coalitions across the state of Florida and will help expecting and new families with baby items so they can focus on the health of their baby.

The Florida Healthy Start program provides education, support and proven interventions to expecting and new families who are atrisk of a poor birth outcome or delay in development.

It focuses on common issues or conditions that occur during pregnancy or in infancy and offer Home Visiting, Prenatal Education & Support, Free Screening & Services, Parenting Education & Support, Care Coordination, Health and Well-Being, and more.

Families can participate in Healthy Start beginning in pregnancy and until their baby reaches age one. Services can be extended if needed up to age three.

It is voluntary and available statewide to all eligible families.

Thanks to donations in the FMA's Greatest Baby Shower, the FMA was able to supply over 73,186 Diapers, 104,155 Baby Wipes, 493 Baby Bottles, 226 tubes of Diaper Cream, 3,686 pieces of Baby Clothes,

Positive outcomes from FSYR programs

At the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, we are celebrating the graduating class of 2025. We're so proud of the youth who worked hard to get back on grade level, take extra classes, and build a learning plan that led to a high school diploma.

We'd like to introduce to one of those seniors. Christian has been

at the Boys Ranch for almost three years. His primary reason for coming to the Ranch was to combat an intense case of apathy.

"I just didn't care about anything due to my past," Christian remembered. "I started failing in my academics. I was really disrespectful to my grandmother. I just wasn't doing anything."

The catalyst for this behavior, Christian shared, was his father being sentenced to prison.

His grandmother was now responsible for a sixteen-year-old whose outlook on life was becoming darker and darker. She looked for a solution for her grandson that would help push Christian through the apathy and show him a life worth living.

"When I first got to the Ranch, I thought ... nothing," Christian said. "I didn't care until I met Ms. Jacobs."

Ms. Jacobs is the Boys Ranch Program Director. She sat in on Christian's interview, listening to his story and gauging whether he would be a good fit for the program.

"She was the first person I really connected with, where I could joke around and just not have a single worry," Christian recalled.

Christian agreed to come to the Ranch, and began the structured schedule of school, chores, homework, and cottage life. Everyone at the Ranch knows each other, and it was a lot for him to adjust to. He came off as quiet and reserved, rarely cracking a smile. Over time, a few folks managed to break through the ve-

neer and meet the true Christian.

The easiest way to meet the real Christian was to earn his respect. His cottage parents accomplished this by meeting Christian where he was with a no-nonsense attitude.

"When I first met [Pop Petty], I had a smart remark, and he gave me one right back," Christian said with a smile. "I respected that."

Our Cottage Parents are unique people. They understand that our youth come from hard places, but that doesn't mean they can walk all over the adults. Mom and Pop set the expectations in the cottage and treat Ranchers with the respect they want to receive in turn.

The teachers at Donald Ralph Cooke School follow this same rulebook. Bad days and challenging behaviors are met with patience and calm, not screaming and belittling. This environment helped Christian change course in his academics.

"The teachers gave us respect as students," Christian said, "and then us students gave them

respect back."

The structure at the Ranch and respect for his teachers helped Christian get back on track with his education. He enjoyed listening to lively debates on different topics: everything from legislation to history. He found he even enjoys the devotions his cottage does every evening.

"It's actually intriguing to see everyone's perspective," Christian said.

Quiet as he may be, Christian is always paying attention. He watched as Pop Hager spent time with youth, teaching them the value of a job well done, and setting an example for Christian.

"Just how he walked around and presented himself," Christian



He wants to be a technician in the Information Technology field, but the other details are wide open with possibilities.

We're so glad he has had an opportunity to see positive role models at the Ranch and decide what kind of man he wants to be.

"I would have been in a very deep, dark place if I hadn't come here," Christian said. "I'm not sure yet about my future, but I can't wait to see what it holds."
