.But most of all, enjoy the months ahead, the warmer weather, the smell of barbecue and the anticipation of some vacation time.

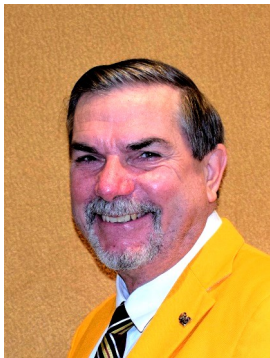

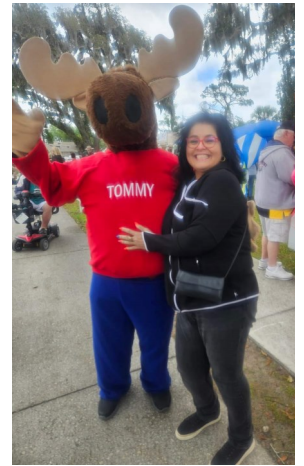

Moose Board of Directors extends Moose rewards program

The program, established in 2015 for an initial five-year period, had been extended until April 30, 2024 by a Board vote several years ago. The recent Board action *eliminates any end date*, although the Board has the ability to terminate the program should it ever fail to provide a benefit to the Fraternity.

Through the Moose Rewards program, all active members have the opportunity to earn points for doing activities to help the Fraternity grow stronger; then redeem those points for items such as lodge dues, convention registrations, catalog sales merchandise, donations through Moose Charities, and even Moose cruise fees.

Katie's Story – Summer Camp



At the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, we're getting ready for another busy summer! Soon our three overnight summer camps will be filled with excited boys and girls wondering what fun activities are in store for them this year.

To meet our campers is to love them. They're just...kids. Regular kids who want to have fun with their friends, discover the correct solution to a challenge, or try something new. As the week winds on, we learn that these loud, funny, excited campers sometimes come from tough places.

Last summer, we met Katie. She arrived at camp the way she always is: heart on her sleeve, smile on her face, ready to make friends. Her personality shined with a kindness that comes from people who know what true hardship is. Katie lives in a rural part of the state with no access to the internet or kids her age. Her grandfather struggles with health problems, and fourteen-year-old Katie is all too aware of what could go wrong.

At summer camp, Katie was not asked to be a caretaker. She didn't have to carry the burden of responsibility anymore. For that week, Katie became a whole new person. Always herself, always joyful, but now surrounded by supportive staff, campers, and deputies. For the first time in a long time, Katie was able to just be a kid.

The effects of summer camp didn't end when Katie went back home. At her middle school, her unfiltered joy and authentic attitude made Katie the target of bullies. But after she returned from camp, Katie came to school with a whole new story to tell. She had left her isolated environment, tried new things like canoeing, archery and high ropes, and made so many new friends, including the School Resource Deputies who work at her school. She knew there were people out

there who cared about her, and more importantly, knew she was worthy of that care

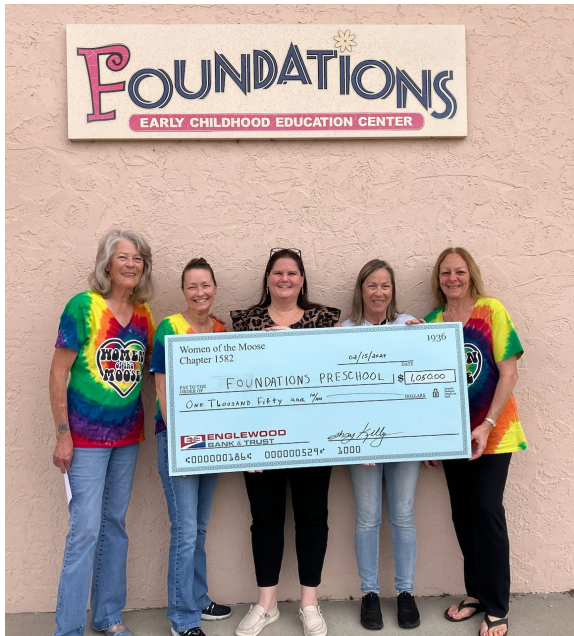
