


with such detail. They truly "Made It Happen!" Incredible work!!



Moose Mobile App is alive and downloadable

Moose Membership Mobile App is Now Live! The Moose Membership Mobile App is live on both **Google Play** and the **Apple App Store**. Members can now download the app for free using their iPhones or any Android phone (i.e. Samsung, Google Pixel, Motorola, etc.). The app includes the new electronic Moose membership card, your Moose membership card, your Moose membership record, the lodge locator, the General Laws of the Fraternity, as well as instant access to pay dues or sign a new member.

Members should use their existing Moose "My Membership Record" user name and password to log in, or register in the app, if they don't have a "My Membership Record" login.




