

Message from Territory Manager/FMA Liaison

So please remember. All lodges have the good, the bad, and the ugly. Let's be positive about them all. I'm positive that we have good things in our lodge and we should be promoting them all the time. I'm positive we have problems. But I'm also positive we can work together to solve them. I'm positive that at times things seem ugly, but there is beauty in all things. We just need to take the time to find it and bring it out.

If you haven't visited Moosehaven lately, make plans to stop by and see the conversion of Florida Hall.

Due to the popularity of the Brandon Place option, just recently, we only had two available apartments, so we expanded once again. Similar to the popular Buckeye Hall apartments, the former Florida residence traditional hall has been converted to Brandon Place apartments giving us an additional 13 apartments. The apartments are 1 and 2 bedroom and range from about 500 sq. ft. – 950 sq. ft. with entry fees ranging from \$135k - \$179k and monthly fees ranging from \$1000 to \$1210. The monthly fee at Florida Hall includes all utilities, including electric, water, Wi-fi and cable TV service.

Both Buckeye and Florida halls have individual fully equipped apartments yet in a community setting where residents share comfortable common spaces for socializing.
