BY-LAWS OF FLORIDA MOOSE ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of the Association will be the Florida Moose Association, Inc, hereafter referred to as the Association, a Florida non-for-profit corporation.

ARTICLE II OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Association are to bring together in closer fraternal cooperation the lodges of the Loyal Order of Moose and the chapters of the Women of the Moose and their membership in the state of Florida; to aid and promote the purposes of Moose International; to build the membership strength of the Moose; to exchange ideas and ideals which may be of benefit to the various lodges, chapters and their members; to promote interest in the work of Ritual Staffs and similar units; to encourage a broader interest in Moose sports and family activities; to stimulate participation in community service programs; to adopt programs and projects for the betterment of Mooseheart and Moosehaven; to include the building of the Endowment Fund for the support of these institutions; to foster closer relationship between lodges and chapters in the State of Florida, and Moose fraternal units in neighboring states, and to coordinate the programs and directives of Moose International, Inc. and the Supreme Lodge.

ARTICLE III AUTHORITY

The Association at all times will be amenable to and under the supervision of Moose International, Inc. and the Supreme Lodge, its officers, the Supreme Council, and be bound and governed by the Constitution and By-Laws of Moose International and the Supreme Lodge of the Loyal Order of Moose. These By-Laws or any amendments hereto,

will be subject to approval of the General Governor, Supreme Lodge, Loyal Order of Moose.

ARTICLE IV MEMBERSHIP

Membership in the Association will consist of all lodges of the Loyal Order of Moose and chapters of the Women of the Moose in the State of Florida that are in good standing with Moose International, and the Florida Moose Association. For a lodge or chapter to be in good standing with the Florida Moose Association, the lodge or chapter must be current with its Association dues, and must be represented at District meetings, Leadership training sessions, workshops and the Association's mid-year conferences and conventions as required by the Association, Moose International or the Supreme Lodge.

ARTICLE V COMPOSITION

Section 1. For convenience in carrying out the functions of the Association, Districts comprised of geographically related lodges and chapters, will be established by the Board of Officers of the Association.

Section 2. The lodges and chapters to be included in the various Districts may be altered from time to time and new Districts established as determined by the Board of Officers.

ARTICLE VI DELEGATES

Section 1. Each good standing lodge and chapter in the Association will be entitled to be represented in the meetings of the Association by two (2) delegates who for the lodge should be the Governor and Administrator, and for the chapter should be the Senior Regent and the Recorder plus one (1) additional delegate for each fifty (50) "active" members on the rolls, or a majority fraction thereof. No lodge or chapter will be entitled to a representation exceeding fifteen (15) delegates, nor cast more than fifteen (15) votes.

The fifteen (15) delegates shall be comprised of eligible Past Governors/Past Regents of the member lodge or chapter. In addition to voting “delegates” each lodge and chapter may have non-voting members in attendance.

Section 2. Each delegate elected to represent their lodge or chapter at a meeting of the Association and present for a vote of the Association will be entitled to one vote, providing the total number of votes does not exceed the number entitled the lodge or chapter, and subject to the limitations contained in Section 1 of this Article.

Section 3. All Past Presidents of the Association, and all members of the Board of Officers of the Association, who are members of lodges or chapters in good standing within the Association and Moose International, will be entitled to all the rights and privileges of a Delegate, and will not be counted as part of the lodge or chapter entitlement referred to in Section 2 of this Article.

Section 4. The Regional Manager, FMA Liaison, Territory Managers, and Chapter Analyst Coordinator appointed to serve the Association, will be entitled to all the rights and privileges of a Delegate, and will not be counted as part of the lodge or chapter entitlement referred to in Section 2 of this Article.

ARTICLE VII QUORUM

Section 1. Any number of duly accredited Delegates, representing at least a majority of the member lodges and chapters in good standing, will constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any duly authorized session of the Association; provided, that the President, Vice President, Prelate or Junior Past President (in that order) be present to preside.

Section 2. A majority of all votes cast will decide all questions except those which involve amendment, alteration or addition to these By-Laws, or an appeal from the decision

of the Chair, either of which will require a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the duly accredited Delegates in attendance.

ARTICLE VIII ELECTED OFFICERS

The elected Officers of the Association will consist of a President, Vice President, Prelate, Secretary, Treasurer and one (1) District President from each District within the Association. Each will be a member in good standing of a lodge or chapter in good standing in the Association and Moose International.

ARTICLE IX BOARD OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The Board of Officers of this Association will be composed of the elected and appointed officers and the Junior Past President who are members of lodges or chapters in good standing with the Association and Moose International, and who are themselves in good standing within their respective lodges or chapters. The Regional Manager, FMA Liaison and Territory Managers, Supreme Lodge Officers and appointees, who are in good standing with their respective lodge or chapter, and whose lodge or chapter – if a member lodge or chapter of the Association – is in good standing with the Association will also serve on the Board of Officers of the Association. Supreme Lodge representatives and Appointees will include the following: Supreme Lodge Officers (including but not limited to: Supreme Council Members, Past Supreme Governors, Supreme Inner Guard, Supreme Outer Guard and Supreme Sergeant-at-Arms), Justices of the Supreme Forum, Deputy Supreme Governors, Moose Legion Area Managers, Moose Legion Ambassadors, members of the following Mooseheart International Boards or Committees: Mooseheart Board of Directors, Moosehaven Board of Directors, Moose Charities Board of Directors, Moose Foundation Board of Directors, Heart of the Community Committee, Judiciary Committee, Activities Committee, Moose Legion Council, Government Relations Committee, Grand Council member, Grand Regent, Deputy Grand Regent, Chapter Analyst Coordinator, College

of Regents Board, Star Recorder Board, Academy of Friendship Board, Loss Prevention Committee and such other Boards or Committees created by the Supreme Lodge and so notified in writing to the Association by the General Governor. The FMA Executive Committee has added the position of Assistant Secretary who will be on the Board of Officers and who will be a non-voting member of the FMA Executive Committee.

Section 2. The Board of Officers, during the times that the Association is not in session, will take general charge and supervision of the affairs of the Association and perform such duties as may be necessary and proper to protect the interests, promote the welfare and accomplish the objectives of the Association; it will carefully and judiciously control the finances of the Association and approve the Budget Committee proposed budget for the disbursement of Association funds. The Executive Committee will fix the salary of the Secretary and it is to be approved by the Board of Officers and membership. It will have the right to authorize payment of all reasonable expenses incurred on behalf of the Association including reimbursement to Officers or any other member or person doing authorized business on behalf of the Association. It will submit to the Association at each annual meeting a report, in writing, of all its accounts since the last annual meeting. It will perform such other duties as may be imposed upon it by these By-Laws or by the Association.

Section 3. A majority will constitute a quorum of the Board of Officers and the Executive Committee. The President and Secretary of the Association will be respectively, Chairman and Secretary of the Board of Officers and the Executive Committee.

Section 4. Except where prohibited by these By-Laws, the Board of Officers, between meetings of said Board, will have the right, by recorded action, to delegate its powers, except the power to appropriate the funds of the Association, to an Executive Committee consisting of the President, Vice-President, Junior Past President, Prelate, Secretary, Treasurer, and FMA Liaison, for the purpose of expediting the

performance of functions otherwise performed by the Board of Officers.

Section 5. The Board of Officers, or the President, with the authority of the Executive Committee, may order a financial review of any funds of the Association including any special fund accounts, and the Chairperson of any committee having a special fund account will submit in writing a full accounting report at any time requested by the Board of Officers, or the President, and at least once a year to the Secretary, whether or not called for at the annual meeting.

Section 6. Each person who is or has been a director or officer of this corporation and who has acted in good faith and in a manner they reasonably believed to be in the best interest of the corporation and with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe their conduct was unlawful, will be indemnified by the corporation against expenses including attorneys' fees necessarily incurred by such person in connection with the defense or settlement in any action or proceeding to which they are a party, alone or together with others, with reason of their being or having been a director or officer acting in a managerial capacity.

Each person will also be reimbursed by the Association for any amounts paid by such person in satisfaction of any judgment or settlement, which settlement has been previously reviewed and approved by the Executive Committee, in connection with any such act, suit, or proceeding, unless such person will be adjudged in such action, suit or proceeding to be liable for misconduct in the performance of his duties to the corporation.

The foregoing right of indemnifications will be in addition to any other rights to which such persons may be entitled as a matter of law.

ARTICLE X TERM OF OFFICE

Section 1. Each elected Officer, except the Secretary, will be chosen for a term of one (1) year to begin following the close of the convention at which that officer is elected. The Secretary will be elected for a term of three (3) years which will begin following the close of the convention at which the Secretary is elected. Each officer will serve until their successor has been duly elected and installed.

Section 2. Vacancies in any of the elected offices will be filled by the Executive Committee, for the unexpired term.

Section 3. The President, with the consent and approval of the Executive Committee, will have the power to declare any office vacant except the office of Secretary, if in the President's opinion the occupant has failed to perform the duties of such office. The office of Secretary may be declared vacant providing that the majority of the Executive Committee vote that, in their opinion, the occupant had failed to perform the duties of the office.

ARTICLE XI NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The Nominating Committee of the Association will consist of members of the Board of Officers, four (4) Past Association Presidents in order of juniority by service together with five (5) representatives appointed by the President, who will be Past Association Presidents, or Committee Chairpersons, and the five will be selected from either lodges and or chapters in good standing with the Association and Moose International.

Section 2. This committee will place in nomination at least one candidate for each office to be filled. Names may be sent to the Nominating Committee which will be given due consideration. Any eligible member of the Association, who has submitted their name for a specific office, but not nominated by the Nominating Committee, will have their name placed upon the ballot by filing a petition with the

Secretary of the Association, prior to the beginning of the session at which the election is to be held, containing the names and lodge or chapter number of not less than ten (10) percent of the registered Delegates attending the annual meeting. A Past President of the Association is ineligible to serve in any elected office of the Association unless prior dispensation is obtained from the General Governor.

Section 3. The nominee for President of the Association must be a Past Governor or Past Regent of the Order and served at least one year in an elected office of the Association.

Section 4. Each district will hold a district caucus in July for the purpose of selecting their recommendation for District President, and electing their District Vice President, Prelate, Secretary and Treasurer. The selection for the District President will be submitted in writing to the Association Secretary by August 15th and the Secretary will receive the same on behalf of the Association Nominating Committee. The written notice should contain a resume' of the person selected. *The Association Nominating Committee will only consider the district selection for District President as a recommendation by the district.*

The District Nominating Committee will consist of the following:

- a. The elected District Officers (President, Vice President, Prelate, Secretary and Treasurer).
- b. The District Junior Past President
- c. The Governor and Administrator of each good standing lodge in the district, and the Senior Regent and Recorder of each good standing chapter in the district.
- d. Any Past President of the Association who is a good standing member of a good standing lodge or chapter in the district.

The District Nominating Procedures will be:

- a. The District President will notify all members of the District Nominating Committee of the date, time and location of the committee meeting at least two (2) weeks prior to the date of the meeting.

- b. There will be no pro-tem members on the committee.
- c. The District President will preside over the proceedings unless the District President appoints another Past District President to preside.
- d. The report of the District Nominating Committee will be submitted at the regular scheduled business meeting in July for the purpose of selecting a qualified member to be recommended for District President and the election of a District Vice President, Prelate, Secretary and Treasurer. In the event of a contested office, the selection and election for that contested office will be by secret written ballot.
- e. The results of the selection and election will be immediately forwarded to the Association Secretary by August 15th.
- f. The District Nominating Committee will meet in closed-door sessions with only members of the District Nominating Committee present. All matters before the District Nominating Committee are strictly confidential.
- g. To be eligible for the office of District President, the candidate should be a Past Governor or Past Regent of the Order, and will have completed at least one (1) year in an elected office in a lodge or chapter in the district unless the General Governor has granted a dispensation waiving this requirement.

The District Election Procedures are such that the lodges and chapters voting in the business meeting must be in good standing in the Supreme Lodge or Women of the Moose and the Florida Moose Association and will be limited to the number of votes as specified in Article VI (Delegates). Also, all delegates voting in said election must be certified as to their good standing status in the lodge or chapter and that every lodge and chapter represented in the election will be limited to the number of delegates or alternates present when votes are cast.

Section 5. At the annual meeting of the Association, the Nominating Committee will report during the first business session.

Section 6. The election of officers will be held during the second day of the annual meeting. In the event of a

contested office, the election for that office will take place by written ballot.

Section 7. The Officers, elected and appointed, will be installed into office prior to the close of the annual meeting utilizing the ritual provided by Moose International.

Section 8. The printing, circulating or distribution of any written or printed matter, resolutions, letters, tickets, sample ballots, or written communication through any electronic media (email, facsimile, etc.) by a member or anyone acting on behalf of a member, suggesting, recommending, opposing or containing the names of a proposed candidate for any Association office, is hereby prohibited. For any violation of this section, the General Governor may suspend the offending member or members, and in his judgment, disqualify a candidate for office or void the election of any officer or officers actively or tacitly involved in such conduct and order a new election.

ARTICLE XII MEETINGS

Section 1. There will be an annual meeting, hereafter called "convention" and a mid-year meeting, hereafter called "mid-year conference" of the Association to be held at such a place as has been determined by the Board of Officers. Each year, the convention of the Association should be held in September and the mid-year conference of the Association should be held in March or April. The time devoted to both the mid-year conferences and conventions of the Association will each be limited to three (3) days or six (6) sessions.

Section 2. With the consent of the General Governor, the Board of Officers may call other meetings of the Association when in its opinion the interests and welfare of the Association justify it.

Section 3. A registration fee, as determined by the Board of Officers may be charged those members attending the mid-year conference and/or convention of the Association.

ARTICLE XIII ASSOCIATION DUES

Section 1. Each lodge and chapter of the Association will remit to the Association Secretary on the first day of May of each year, a sum equivalent to seventy five cents (\$.75) per “active” member on the rolls of the lodge or chapter, the computation to be based upon the certified reports of the lodges and chapters within the Association submitted to Moose International, for the period ending January 31st; provided however, that in no case will the payment of Association dues for any one lodge or chapter exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00).

Section 2. The Association will operate on a fiscal year beginning October 1st and ending September 30th the following year. Annual dues will be considered delinquent after May 31st of each calendar year.

Section 3. No member lodge or chapter delinquent in its Association dues will participate in meetings or activities of the Association. This expressly prohibits group or team entries such as Ritual Teams, bowling and other athletic team participation in any Association activities unless Association dues are paid for the current year, as covered in Section 1 of this Article. This Section will not prohibit a Moose member in good standing of a lodge or chapter, delinquent in its Association dues, from attending any and all sessions of the mid-year conferences or conventions of the Association, provided he or she is a registered attendee, but he or she will not be a qualified voting Delegate on issues at the sessions.

ARTICLE XIV DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President will be the Chief Executive Officer of the Association. The President will preside over all meetings of the Association, the Board of Officers and the Executive Committee and will appoint officers and committees and call meetings of the Board of Officers and Executive Committee at such times as the business of the Association may require. The President will, with the FMA

Liaison, supervise and correlate the activities and visitations of the District Presidents and will have authority to visit the lodges and chapters which are members of the Association. The President will appoint a Sergeant-at-Arms, Assistant Sergeant-at-Arms, Inner and Outer Guards and Assistant Inner and Outer Guards as the President may deem necessary. The President or the Treasurer, the Secretary or Assistant Secretary will sign all authorized checks.

Section 2. In the absence of the President at a stated meeting of the Association or the Board of Officers or Executive Committee, the Vice President, Prelate or the Junior Past President will preside in that order.

Section 3. The Secretary will keep a true and correct record of all of the proceedings of the Association, the Board of Officers and the Executive Committee, and promptly attend to all correspondence and perform all duties usually pertaining to the office of Secretary. The Secretary will give adequate surety bond in an amount to be fixed by the Board of Officers, the premium on which will be paid from the treasury funds of the Association, which checks will then be countersigned by the Treasurer and/or the President. The Secretary will submit an annual report to the Association showing the condition thereof and of the lodges and chapters within the jurisdiction of the Association, so far as the Secretary is able to ascertain. The Secretary will receive and account for all monies turned into the Association and will furnish the Treasurer with duplicate deposit slips showing all funds deposited to Association accounts, and will perform such other duties as may be properly required. The Secretary will receive such compensation for service as may be determined by the Board of Officers and membership. An Assistant Secretary has been appointed by the Executive Committee to be available to handle the Secretary duties in case of illness or the Secretary is unable to perform those duties.

Section 4. The Vice-President will assist the President in the conducting of business of the Association at mid-year conferences and conventions. The Vice-President will be the major alternate to the President in making visitations and

promoting the purpose and goals of the Association consistent with the purposes and goals of the Fraternity.

Section 5. The Treasurer will, at all times, be kept informed by the Association Secretary, as to the true financial status of the Association and will perform such other duties as the Board of Officers may consider necessary to the Association. The Treasurer will assist the Secretary in the preparation of the annual Budget and financial report and will countersign all checks drawn on the funds of the Association that are properly authorized.

Section 6. The Prelate will open and close all meetings of the Association with appropriate prayer.

Section 7. The Sergeant-at-Arms and the assistant (if any) will execute the orders of the President during the sessions of the Association, assist in preserving order, and act as Marshals on public occasions and in parades.

Section 8. The Inner Guard and Outer Guard and their assistants, will take charge of the door during all sessions of the Association and will permit only such persons to enter as are duly qualified representatives or as may be directed by the President of the Association.

Section 9. Each District President will:

[a] Visit a Lodge General Meeting or Chapter Membership Meeting or Lodge/Chapter Joint Meeting and should attend one Lodge or Chapter function for each Lodge/Chapter in the District as often as possible but no less than once each quarter, for the purpose of encouraging and promoting progress in the development of fraternal programs.

[b] Encourage each lodge and chapter in the District to continue its affiliation with the Association and cooperate with the Secretary of the Association in the collection of Association dues.

[c] Be responsible for promoting proper fund raising programs that will help defray the expense of operating the Association. Such fund raising programs will be conducted in such a manner that will cause no discredit nor reproach to the Association and the Moose Fraternity in general, and such programs may be subject to the scrutiny of the Executive Committee. The District President will be responsible for remitting all funds to the Secretary of the Association and will render an accounting of such funds immediately following the district meeting at which the fund raising was finalized. The District President will cooperate with the Association Officers in the collection of funds in connection with any program sponsored by the Association.

[d] Encourage membership promotion in cooperation with the Membership Department of Moose International and the Regional Manager, FMA Liaison, Territory Managers and Chapter Analyst Coordinator.

[e] Cooperate with the Association Ritual Chairperson in encouraging the formation of lodge and chapter Ritual Staffs and to encourage perfection and efficiency by the lodge and chapter officers in their charges as well as the exemplification of the ritual in all lodge and chapter ceremonies.

(f) Attend all Board of Officers meetings of the Association.

(g) Cooperate with Association Chairpersons in all authorized activity in the District.

(h) Prepare a written report to be given at the meetings of the Association covering all phases of activities within the District.

(i) Hold monthly District meetings during each fiscal year of the Association (1 October through September 30). The meetings of the District will be conducted in accordance with an agenda furnished by the Association.

(j) Meet monthly with the elected officers of the District and the Governors and Administrators of the lodges and the Senior Regents and Recorders of the chapters within the District, who will be members of the District Executive Committee.

(k) Each District President shall obtain an invitation to attend the General Membership Meetings or Joint Meeting at a lodge or chapter he/she is not an active member of, from the Lodge Governor, Chapter Senior Regent, or Presiding Officer for the purpose of performing the duties referred to in Article XIV, Section 9.

ARTICLE XV COMMITTEES

Section 1. The standing committees of the Association will be as follows:

- Ritual Committee
- Rules and Order Committee
- Sports Committee
- Youth Awareness Committee

and such other committees as may be deemed necessary by the Board of Officers, and/or Moose International.

Section 2. The Financial Review Committee will be appointed by the Executive Committee and consist of 3 members, one who will be the Chairperson. A Financial Review will be performed prior to the Mid-Year and Annual Convention with a report being made to the membership. The proposed annual budget will be made by the incoming President, Treasurer, FMA Liaison, Secretary and Finance Committee Chairman.

Section 3. Except where otherwise provided, all committees will be appointed by the President, with the approval of the Board of Officers at the conclusion of the convention, and the members thereof will serve until the adjournment of the next convention or until their successors have been appointed. All other committees may be appointed at or before the convention at which the appointing President will preside.

ARTICLE XVI ORDER OF BUSINESS

Agenda for the conventions and mid-year conferences will be established by Moose International and coordinated with the Association's Rules and Order Committee through the FMA Liaison, but in the event of no such action the order of business will be as follows:

4. Appointment of necessary committees
5. Report of Officers
6. Reports of Committees

7. Report of Nominating Committee

11. Installation of Officers
12. Adjournment

ARTICLE XVII HONORARY PAST PRESIDENT

The Association may, at its convention, after recommendation by the Resolutions Committee, confer the title of Honorary Past President upon a member of the Loyal Order of Moose or Woman of the Moose.

ARTICLE XVIII ADOPTION – EFFECT – AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws will become effective when adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Association at its 2019 convention meeting after being approved by the General Governor of the Supreme Lodge, Loyal Order of Moose.

No amendment, alteration or addition to these By-Laws will be made unless the same will have been presented, in writing, to the By-Laws Committee, passed on by the committee, pre-approved by the General Governor, and will only become effective after being ratified by two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast at a convention of the Association.

ARTICLE XIX RULES OF ORDER

Except as may otherwise be provided, Robert's Rules of Order will govern all parliamentary proceedings of the Association.
