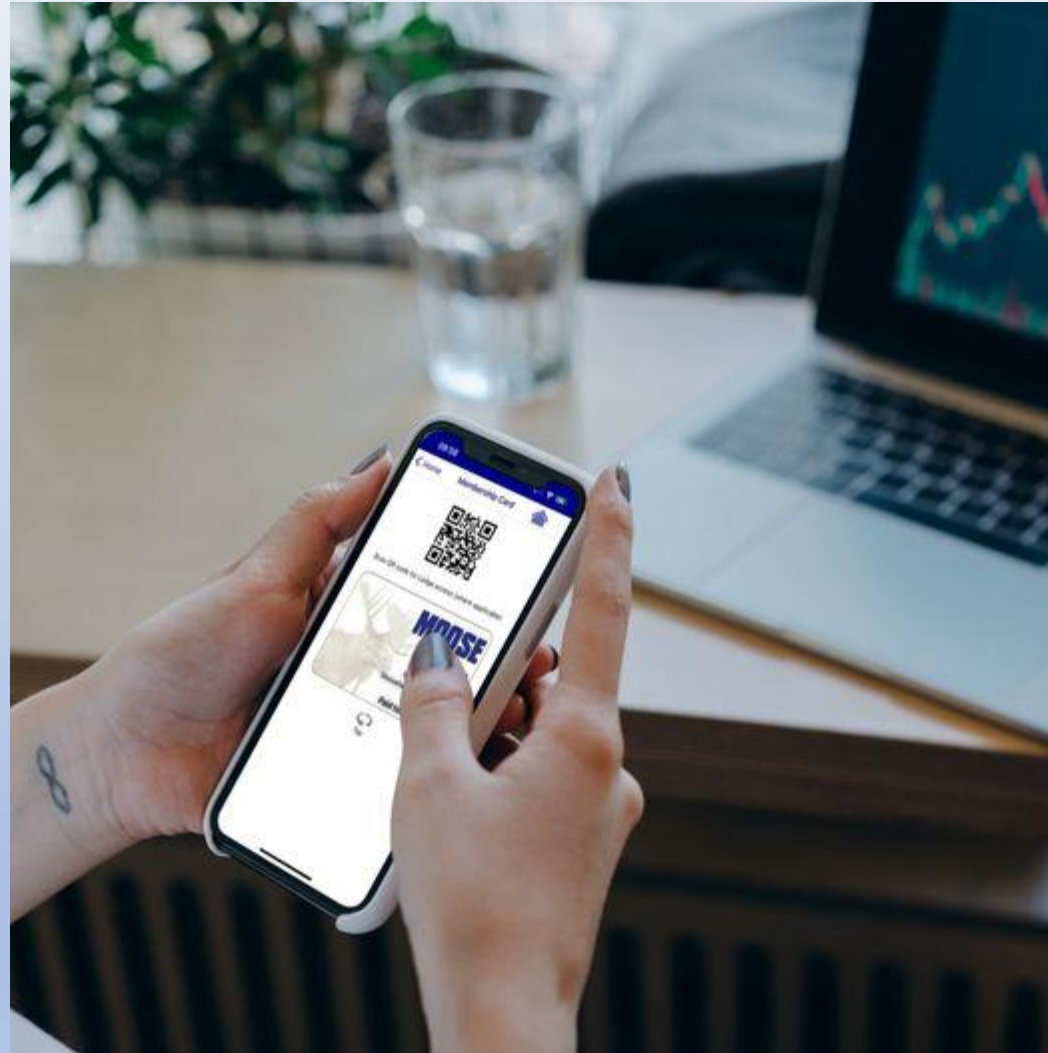

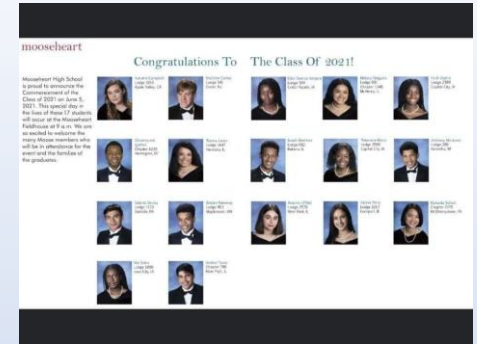

Mooseheart & Moosehaven Endowment

- The Endowment Fund was created in 1918 for the purpose of ensuring continued funding of Mooseheart.
- The measure was officially passed at the 1919 convention. The original intention was that Lodges and chapters take up a “penny collection” at regular meetings and other Lodge activities.
- The collection became part of the 9 O'clock ceremony and thus a part of Moose tradition.
- The money collected is not spent but invested and the interest earned supports Mooseheart and Moosehaven. The fund is managed by a board of trustees.



CAMP ROSS

Mooseheart Camp Ross, a project of the Moose Legion, provides year-round camping facilities for Mooseheart children. It is located near Mount Morris, IL, about 70 miles west of Mooseheart. The camp consists of approximately 150 acres of rolling woodlands, fishing streams, lakes, and ponds. Mooseheart students spend vacation time at Camp Ross each summer and during the winter months.

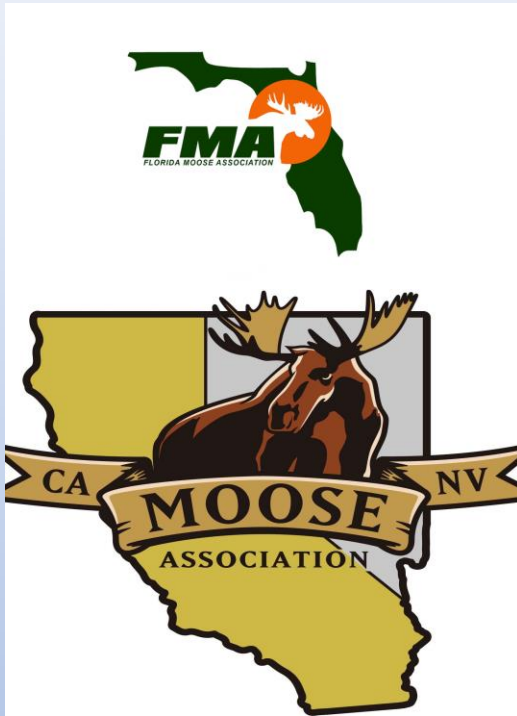

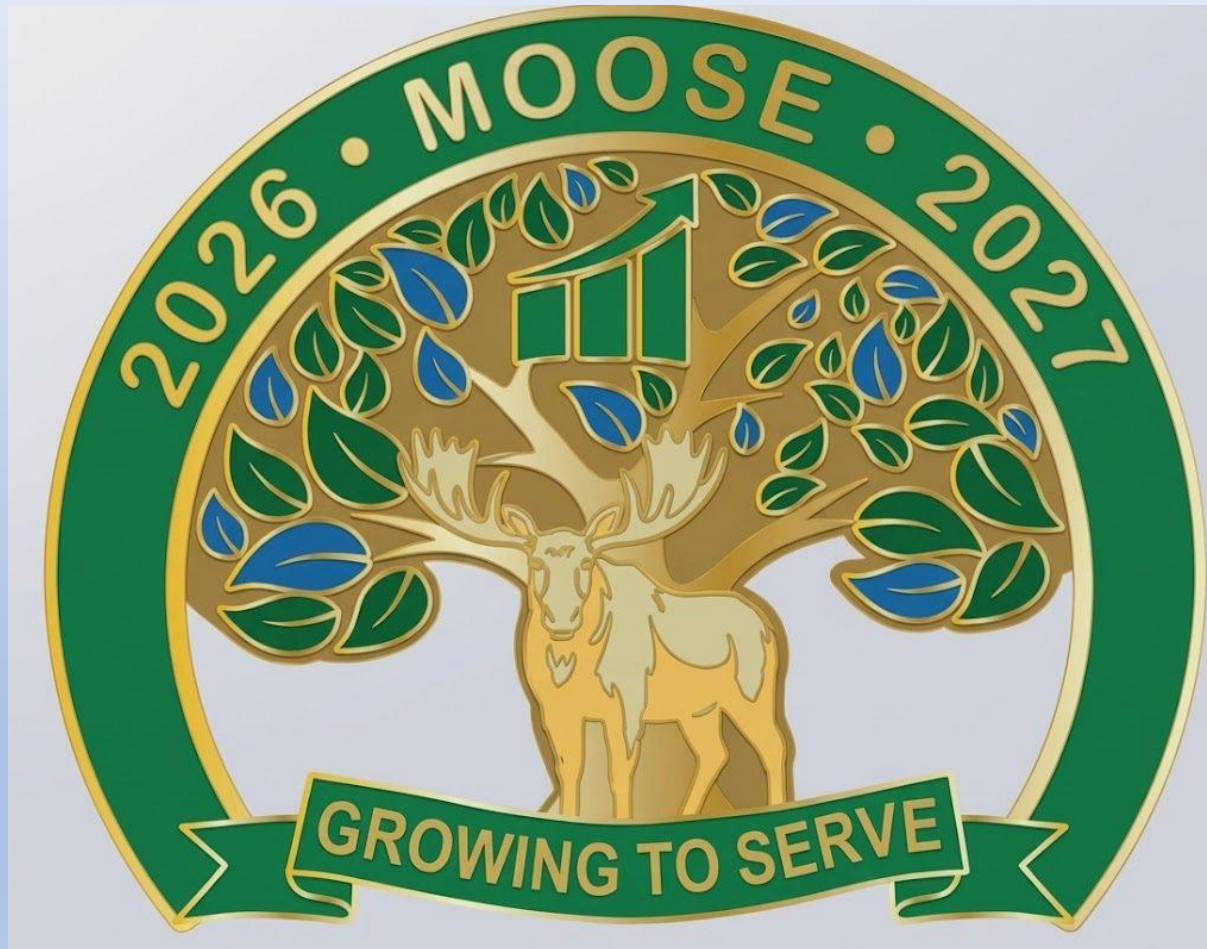




Moose's Annual Convention – Go!




There are four levels within the program – Preferred, Power, Prestige and Platinum.

Target: Members who are just beginning to engage or contribute on a local level


Goal: Welcome them into the community and encourage further involvement

- Jurisdictions organize events and raise significant funds.
- Known as the 'Degree of Service' and the 'Fun Degree'.
- Mission: 'To have fun while providing greater service to the Moose fraternity.'

Rules and Bylaws

There are rules and By-laws which both Moose International and the Lodge Executive Board have created over the years to ensure a pleasurable social environment, proper decorum, and Lodge safety. These rules and by-laws are posted in the social quarters and should be reviewed as soon as possible. There are, however, some rules we want to bring to your attention.

1. No firearms, knives, or weapons of any kind are to be brought into the lodge for any reason, unless the member is on duty law enforcement. Breech of this law could result in expulsion from the fraternity.
 2. No fighting, rude gestures, offensive language or conduct unbecoming of a Lady or Gentlemen will be tolerated.
 3. No negative criticism of the Moose Fraternity, lodge members, officers, committees, or general lodge interest inside or outside of lodge property. (DON'T TALK POORLEY OF YOUR FRATERNAL BROTHERS AND SISTERS!)
 4. Abide by the lodge dress code posted in the social quarters.
 5. Respect the Bartenders. They have overall control of the social quarters while on duty and are responsible for your safety and wellbeing. Many lodges state that if a bartender cuts you off, you have 30 seconds to leave or 30 days to think about it.
- Please note that failure to abide by the rules/bylaws could result in fine, suspension, or expulsion from the lodge or Moose fraternity.

We need YOU!! A Burden heavy to one, is borne light by many.

One of the most important structures in the Moose Lodge/Fraternity is our volunteers. Unlike public establishments, most of our officers, committees, cleaners, cooks (depending on each lodge), general lodge maintenance and upkeep as well as activity coordinators are solely reliant lodge members volunteering to help out. Many times, then the same group of people take responsibility for these tasks without relief and eventually become burned out. Members take for granted this fraternity needs the help of all members to ensure proper functioning. Each and every member has their own unique talents which could be used to serve the lodge in such positive ways. Whether you are a cook , electrician, accountant or decorator, these are talents that would help make our lodge a better place. As time goes by you may be asked to volunteer, but never forced. Please be respectful to those that do and don't be afraid to step up!
